Brief Report of Main Activities

I. JANUARY

 Handover Tasks of ASEAN Autism Network (AAN) Secretariat from Asia-Pacific Development Center on Disability (APCD) to London School Centre for Autism Awareness (LSCAA)

A briefing was held on the additional management responsibilities of the ASEAN Autism Network (AAN) that London School Centre for Autism Awareness (LSCAA) has taken up when its regular operations resumed. In addition to its function as a key partner, the Asia-Pacific Development Center on Disability (APCD) also served as a mentor to AAN Indonesia periodically passing on lessons learned, challenges, and future directions to AAN Indonesia following the secretariat turnover.

For the future of AAN, the organization commits to being a long-term, self-sufficient, and independent self-advocacy network for people with autism, as well as an international self-advocacy network for people with autism, to improve the lives of people with autism on a larger scale, and to further promote an inclusive community for everyone.

 APCD conducted a Workshop on Handover Tasks of AAN Secretariat from APCD to LSCAA on 20 January 2021



Past experiences and lessons learned by APCD – both logistical and activity-related matters – were exchanged.



The workshop was attended by core management team members from the LSCAA, including the AAN Chairman, Honorary Chairperson, and AAN Secretariat team.



Empowering messages to support the moving forward of AAN for the next decades were shared.

Distribution of Reusable Masks (Corporate Social Responsibility – CSR)

In December 2020, the AAN Secretariat received 26 boxes of 800 pieces each, for a total of 28,800 washable face masks from ASEAN Coordinating Centre for Humanitarian Assistance on disaster management (AHA Centre). Starting in January 2021, these masks were distributed to autism communities in Indonesia through the help of LSCAA.





APCD explained the Project presentation included objectives, expected outcomes and activity plan to the partners.




Project timeline implementation from January to July 2021 was displayed.





Discussions were held on AAN involvement for the ASEAN Day 2021.





• AAN Humanitarian Aid "A Fundraising Campaign" for Myanmar (July 15th, 2021)






AAN Executive Committee Meeting on 30 July 2021


o AAN Executive Committee Meeting on August 31, 2021



Output AAN Executive Committee Meeting 29 September 2021



AAN conducted its monthly Executive Committee Meeting on September 29, 2021. The meeting was held online.



At the meeting, AAN officials provided an update on the COVID-19 pandemic's current status in their various nations. Ms. Candy Hernandez, Executive Director of the AAN Secretariat, provided an update on the AAN Humanitarian Aid Fundraising Campaign for Myanmar, the proceeds of which be transferred to Myanmar in the near future.

o AAN Executive Committee Meeting 28 October 2021




AAN held its monthly Executive Committee Meeting on Thursday, October 28, 2021. The meeting was conducted virtually via online platform.

The AAN Secretariat was invited to the briefing as an ASEAN-affiliated body. Apart from representatives of ASEAN Centers and ASEAN-Associated Entities, the briefing was also open to Missions, Embassies, and Organizations. The briefing was conducted entirely online on a virtual platform.

AAN Executive Committee Meeting 25 November 2021

Opening the meeting, Mr. Cason Tzse Chun Ong, AAN Chairman, discussed the SOP Booklet and suggested adding a clause about conflict of interest. Then, Ms. Supaanong 'NuNu' Panyasirimongkol, APCD's Networking & Collaboration Officer, talked about the possibility of observers in the next AAN meeting, an ambassador, and an intern.

Afterwards, each AAN representative gave an update on the activities in their respective countries. Dr. Adriana Ginanjar, AAN Honorary Chairman, introduced a series of webinars that she is planning about A to Z on Autistic People to be Productive. This event is also prepared with the consultation of APCD, and Mr. Cason gave a short speech at the event.

Ms. Erlinda Uy Koe, Chairperson of the Public Relations and Information Committee, was also preparing for an event, a webinar about Nurturing Care. She also announced that the Philippines, unfortunately, was not going to hold the Angels Walk in January because the type of event cannot be duplicated online. Therefore, they moved on to other events.

Ms. Supaanong and Mr. Watcharapol from APCD Community Development Department Team, also announced that the CEP Guidebook was ready to be released, and it is available in 10 languages, including English, Thai, Khmer, Bahasa Indonesia, Laotian, Bahasa Melayu, Burmese, Tagalog, Vietnamese, and Japanese. The book is a guidebook on physical activities for autistic people, people with intellectual disabilities, and people with psychosocial disabilities during lockdown. The AAN Secretariat was also received a complete box set that contains all 10 languages.




The first webinar on the series of "A-Z Preparing People on The Autism Spectrum to be Productive" was held on Sunday, 5th of December 2021. This first session was also marked by the Opening Ceremony for the series. It opened with remarks from Dr. Adriana Ginanjar (YAI & AAN Honorary Chairman), Mr. Muhammad Luthfi (Terapeutik), and Ms. Eva Kasim (KEMENSOS RI). Dr. Adriana addressed the importance of being productive,

because lack of productivity in people on the spectrum could lead to emotional and behavioral problems.






In the Opening Ceremony, Mr. Cason Ong (AAN Chairman) and Mr. Piroon Laismit (APCD Executive Director) also gave their remarks. Mr. Cason explained how the issue is especially relevant in the post COVID-19 world, since it is important to include everyone in workforce, to help rebuild the economy. Meanwhile, Mr. Piroon Laismit highlighted how being productive could improve the quality of life of persons with disabilities, including persons in the autism spectrum. Last but not least, Ms. Aiko Akiyama from UN ESCAP described that there are a number of programs for people with disabilities in the Asia Pacific, however, those that addressed persons on the autism spectrum specifically are still lacking. Therefore, she expressed her wish to collaborate more with institutions and organizations focused on autism in the region in the future.


AAN Participated in Webinar Series "A-Z Preparing People on The Autism Spectrum to be Productive" Session on Best Practice of Disability Inclusive Employment featuring APCD & Vocational Consultant from USA on 18 December 2021

The Webinar Series "A-Z Preparing People on The Autism Spectrum to be Productive" organized by Indonesian Autism Foundation (Yayasan Autisma Indonesia/YAI) and Terapeutik continued with a session by professionals on disability inclusive employment. The session was held on Saturday, 18th of December 2021, focusing on Best Practices in Thailand and USA from the perspective of Vocational Consultants from each country. ASEAN Autism Network (AAN) is also one of the partner institutions that supported this event.



The first speaker was Kevin Cook, Community and Vocational Services Consultant, Cape Fear Group Homes and Vocational Services. Mr. Cook shared about job development, job placement, and job training for individuals with disabilities from his experience in Cape Fear Group Homes and Vocational Services, North Carolina, USA. Mr. Cook also has collaborated with US Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, in his work.





The second speaker in this session was Mr. Somchai Rungsilp, Community

Development Manager, Asia-Pacific Development Center on Disability (APCD). Mr.

Somchai introduced the concept of Disability Inclusive Business (DIB), an emerging business trend that strives to incorporate persons with disabilities in work and employment. Persons with disabilities become main customers, employees, employers, and entrepreneurs, which will contribute to creating a "disability-friendly environment".



 Arrival and Launch of Online Campaign for "Hapi-ie Guidebook on Physical Activities for Persons with Autism, Intellectual Disabilities and Psychosocial Disabilities"







The Hapi-ie Guidebook arrived at the AAN Secretariat. It is a guidebook on physical activities for people with autism, intellectual disabilities, and psychosocial disabilities under the JICA Community Empowerment Programme (CEP) 2021 on "Empowering Parents Group of Children with Special Needs on Physical Activities and Health Promotion to Cope during COVID-19 in ASEAN Countries". It is available in 10 languages (English, Thai, Japanese, Khmer, Bahasa Indonesia, Lao, Bahasa Melayu, Burmese, Tagalog, and Vietnamese).

The Guidebook aims to improve the quality of life and promote a healthy lifestyle through physical activity during the pandemic. The online campaign is also being promoted using the hashtag #HapiieInASEAN.

• AAN Executive Committee Meeting on December 23, 2021

AAN held its monthly Executive Committee Meeting on December 23, 2021. The meeting was conducted virtually via online platform.



At the meeting, Mr. Cason Tzse Chun Ong, Chairman of AAN, suggested writing an official letter to the ASEAN Secretariat about the fundraising campaign for Myanmar. The letter could convey AAN's concern for the wellbeing of autistic people in Myanmar and could affirm that AAN is a close family who wants to help and support members in their times of need. One way is by collecting and donating money to the people of Myanmar, especially families of autistic people.

Mr. Cason also suggested the return of the ASEAN Autism Games in 2022, which Malaysia would like to host. However, it would largely depend on the development of the COVID-19 situation, so the situation would still need to be monitored.

Ms. Supaanong Panyasirimongkol, Networking & Collaboration Officer, Asia-Pacific Development Center on Disability (APCD), offered a few recommendations from APCD for AAN activities in the New Year: (1) AAN and APCD need to make a Yearly Plan/Annual Plan and (2) make a proposal to the ASEAN Secretariat about Autism Mapping Project Phase 2. Mr. Somchai Rungsilp, Community Development Manager, APCD, concurred and advised that the report should consist of 2 levels: (1) Annual Report, i.e., a consolidated report on what each AAN member accomplished during the fiscal year; (2) Annual Planning. Mr. Cason agreed and asked each member to submit a report on their own country and ideas for the yearly plan by the end of January.

Last but not least, the AAN Secretariat presented the offline link for the new website and asked Executive Committee members to review the website. Dr. Adriana Ginanjar, AAN Honorary Chairman, gave the input that the About Us section should be added with a short profile or a brief description of all 10 organizations under AAN. The short profile could be like the one contained in the book Commemorating 10 Years.


